

Intrinsic Finks and the Individuation of Dispositions

Abstract:

Choi (2005, forthcoming) claims that dispositions are not intrinsically finkable, whereas categorical properties are. He also suggests that the intrinsic finkability should serve as a criterion for the dispositional/categorical distinction. In this talk, I will try to argue, against Choi, that both dispositions and categorical properties are intrinsically finkable. I contemplate the individuation of dispositions and argue that, although Choi's claim has intuitive plausibility, nothing in the concept of dispositions would bar dispositions (at least fundamental ones) from having their intrinsic finks or masks.
